Hall reported that he will get in touch with Jay Helker from Bloomfield Youth Baseball, letting him know that the Town needs a Certificate of Liability Insurance, naming the Town as Additionally Insured, and a \$50.00 Refundable Security Deposit before they can use the fields at Veterans Park. Discussion was held. Motion was made by Mitchell, seconded by Fessner, to authorize the expenditure of \$6,488.27 to SDC Contractors to replace the Front Door of the Town Hall. Discussion was held.
