Wille opened the regular Town Board meeting at 7:00 PM.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Council Member Fessner.

Wille welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked them for coming.

Matt Halladay gave a presentation regarding a Clean Energy Community program. Halladay reported the town would need to complete 4 of the 10 actions under the program. Such actions could be to pass a Resolution Establishing Energy Benchmarking Requirements for certain Municipal Buildings, attend an Energy Code Training, and using the NY State Unified Solar Permit Application. Discussion was held. Halladay reported that there is a \$5,000 incentive for towns and villages that get designated in our area in the next year. Discussion was held.

Karl Essler, esq. from Morgenstern DeVoesick reported to the Board that he represents the Youth Fastpitch Softball Group. Essler updated the board on the history of the fastpitch softball application and their frustration with the lack of movement regarding the application. Discussion was held. Denome asked why hasn't there been a response? Denome went on to say "we are talking about 8-11-year-old girls, who live in this community". Denome requested that the Town Board act on their application 1 way or another. Wille reported that he, and Fessner met with School Superintendent Andy Doell, and Athletic Director John Mastin on behalf of both groups. Wille informed Doell and Mastin that the town needs help from the school with field availability. Wille reported that the amount of access to the school is not adequate. Discussion was held. Wille went on to say that he also understands that the "top field" being offered is not an adequate playing field. Wille reported that he left that meeting feeling "not great". Discussion was held. Wille reported that the Town Clerk's responsibility is taking care of occupancies for all town buildings and grounds. Discussion was held. Gochenaur reported that she has not acted on the Bloomfield Youth Fastpitch Softball Application because the Recreation Committee (Fessner & Conradt) wouldn't allow her to. Fessner reported that he doesn't appreciate people not contacting him. Kachmaryk replied "I haven't heard from you in 10 days. That's why were here". Kachmaryk when on to say that there are 42 baseball kids and 47 girls for softball. Discussion was held. Mitchell reported that obviously there is more demand than supply. Mitchell reported that it sounds as if the schedule should be completed within the next day or two. Discussion was held.

TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE EAST BLOOMFIELD TOWN SUPERVISOR TO APPLY FOR AN URBAN FORESTRY COUNCIL ARBOR DAY PROGRAM COMMUNITY GRANT

RESOLUTION 2018-022

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE THE NYS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AMENDMENT B FOR THE 2016-2017 WINTER SEASON

WHEREAS, there are 13.88 lane road miles of New York State highways in the Town of East Bloomfield for which the State contracts with the Town Highway Department for snow and ice control; and

WHEREAS, the Town of East Bloomfield is under contract with New York State Department of Transportation to provide snow and ice control on specified state roads within the Town of East Bloomfield; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement to extend the indexed lump-sum municipal snow and ice agreement for the 2016-2017 season was approved by the Town Board by Resolution 2014-044, adopted on December 8, 2014. Setting an indexed lump-sum estimated expenditure for the 2016-2017 season at \$90,767.24; and

WHEREAS, due to the severity of the winter during 2016-2017, the indexed lump-sum estimated expenditure of providing snow and ice control on specified state roads is revised, as shown in Amendment B, to reflect the additional services and is estimated at \$115,118.81; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Board hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute the New York State Department of Transportation Amendment B for the 2016-2017 winter season, increasing the estimated cost to perform snow and ice control by \$24,351.57.

Motion was made by Wille, seconded by Conradt, to set a Public Hearing for alternate members for the Zoning Board/Planning Board for Monday April 23, 2018 at 7:00PM with the Town Board meeting to begin immediately following.
